Forgiveness ... 6. is a matter of the heart

Matthew 18:34 "This is how my heavenly Father will treat each of you unless you forgive your brother from your heart."



1. making someone pay

2. justifies wrong behaviour

3. always escalates

The forgiveness test Can I pray unreserved blessing on this person?

Matthew 5:44 But I tell you: Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you,



Unforgiveness 1. makes you sick

Hebrews 12:15 See to it that no one falls short of the grace of God and that no bitter root grows up to cause trouble and defile many.



Unforgiveness 2. gives Satan a foothold

2 Corinthinas 2:10-11 Anyone you forgive, I also forgive. And what I have forgiven – if there was anything to forgive – I have forgiven in the sight of Christ for your sake, 11 in order that Satan might not outwit us. For we are not unaware of his schemes.



Unforgiveness

3. sets ourselves up against God Romans 12:17-19

Do not repay anyone evil for evil. Be careful to do what is right in the eyes of everybody. If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone. Do not take revenge, my friends, but leave room for God's wrath, for it is written: "It is mine to avenge; I will repay," says the Lord.



Where do I start? 1. Receive God's forgiveness

Matthew 18:28-30 ... 'Pay back what you owe me!' he demanded. "His fellow-servant fell to his knees and begged him, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay you back.' "But he refused. Instead, he went off and had the man thrown into prison until he could pay the debt.



Where do I start? 2. Choose forgiveness

Matthew 18:28 "But when that servant went out, he found one of his fellow-servants who owed him a hundred denarii.



Where do I start

3. recognise the torture of unforgiveness <u>Matthew 18:31 - 34</u>

When the other servants saw what had happened, they were outraged ...Shouldn't you have had mercy on your fellow servant just as I had on you?" In anger his master handed him over to the jailers to be tortured, until he should pay back all he owed.



Do you know the truth? Jesus has paid



Forgiveness begins when you surrender the urge to get revenge.

Forgiveness is a decision not to make them pay.



Forgiveness is not proved by the state of your actions but by the state of your heart.



Is there a situation where YOU need to break the cycle?

Is there a situation where you are justifying your actions because of what they did?
